- September 27th was Little Brave Camp-Out. We had 298 students and parents attend! Parents and children engaged in interactive games and activities. It was an amazing evening!
- We attended the Saukee Homecoming Parade! We had numerous parents and grandparents walk with us.
- Quanada Presenters were in to teach the students about safety and their bodies.
- International Walk to School Day was October 5th. We had 50 students and multiple parents and community members walk with us.
- Parent teacher conferences were well attended. 401 conferences were scheduled. 342 conferences were completed. We had 85% of our parents attend a conference.
- The Pittsfield Fire Department came and taught students fire safety on October 12th.
- We ended the first quarter. Students are making great progress. Report cards will go home on Friday.
- Tomorrow night is a South School Family Night. Parents and students will be creating scarecrows and learning about Halloween safety from Pike County Deputy Jennifer Thompson. We have 78 families signed up to attend.

- This Friday we will recognize students who have achieved positive behaviors for the entire first quarter.

Administrative Report

Oct. 19, 2016

Grades 3 - 5

- During the week of October 3, I met with my grade-level teams to review assessment data and set goals for math facts and reading fluency.
- On the October 4 and 6 SIP Days, staff completed required GCN trainings for AED, Allergies, Diabetes awareness, and first aid.
- October 5 was National Walk to School Day. Though the weather didn't cooperate there were still approximately thirty-five students, parents, and staff who participated in this event coordinated by Mrs. Marable.
- On October 18 our first Code Red Drill was conducted; though there are a couple of areas we can improve, staff and students responded very well.
- October 22 - Student council will hold a Halloween party for all third through fifth grade students. Students will watch a movie, play games, and tour the haunted hallway.
- October 27 - Staff will participate in ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) Training. This is an options-based program that teaches staff to react proactively in a threatening situation. This training is now preferred to the traditional lockdown approach.
- Also, on October 27 we will have Family Fun Math Night. This event is sponsored by the Regional Office of Education and County Market. Children who attend will get a clipboard and a set of math scavenger hunt questions to complete as they explore the store in search of solutions. PCS and South staff will be on hand to help students solve problems.
- October is "National Bully Prevention and Awareness Month". In an effort to bring awareness to this issue, our PBIS efforts are focusing on bullying this month. The PBIS mini lessons we teach will be related to bullying. Students will also participate in a Bullying presentation. In addition, PCS students and staff will be wearing black on Friday's for the rest of October. Feel free to join us as we blackout bullying.
- The first quarter ended last Friday, and grades will be sent home the end of this week.
