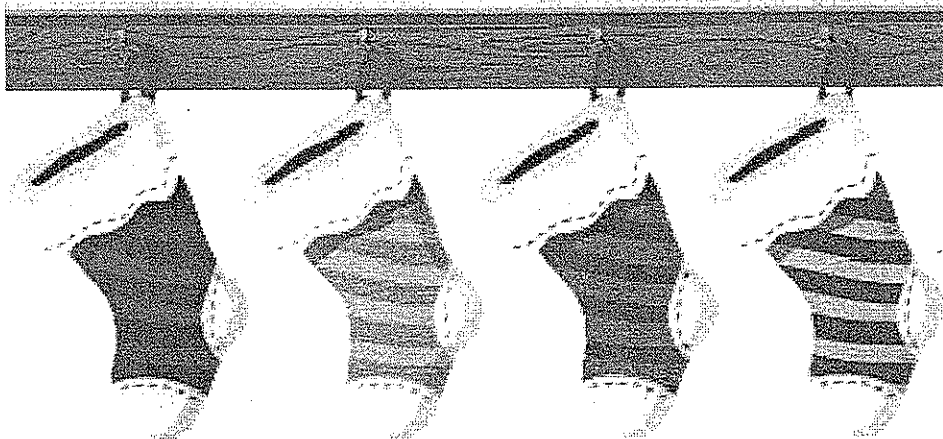
Semester Exams & End of 1st Semester
