Started practice December 8th. First contest is January 5th, 2018.

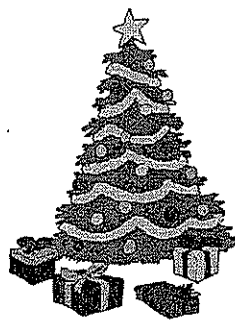
