

**PCS Administrative Report
February 21, 2018
Grades 6-8**

- SIP day – We worked on our vision for our school. We also did some curriculum work in departments.
- Our mid-year MAP benchmark is complete. It went very well and the teachers are already using the results to guide instruction. We had the following growth:

The expected growth is 2pts. I am so proud of all of our students and teachers.

Math Curriculum Meetings

- Mr. Cook met with C pod Teachers on February 5 to work on our math curriculum. We met again on February 13 to continue this work.

SIP Day Feb. 16

- During the first part of the meeting, we worked on the vision for PCS. The second part of the meeting was used to continue our math curriculum work.

DIBELS – Middle of Year Reading Benchmark

- Third grade – improved the number of students reading at or above expected levels from 70% to 74%, which is 4% points of growth.
- Fourth grade – improved the number of students reading at or above expected levels from 65% to 67%, which is 2% points of growth.
- Fifth grade – improved the number of students reading at or above expected levels from 53% to 60%, which is 7% points of growth.

Middle-of-the-Year Math Fact Assessments

The following chart shows the average increase in the number of problems students performed correctly on a sixty-four question addition and multiplication test in a two-minute period. It also shows how they performed on a forty-question subtraction and division test in a two-minute period.

- Math Curriculum Update
 - February 1st SIP Day Math Curriculum Meetings were held with Mr. Denny Cook. We evaluated the scope and sequence of the My Math Series and began to dive into each lesson to identify the essential questions, key skills, and learning standards.
 - February 15th teachers were given time to work with their grade level teams to develop lesson plans for each unit. The goal was to ensure that all students are leaving the classroom being taught the same essential skills. This process will facilitate mapping the math curriculum.
 - February 16th SIP Day was spent doing a data investigation. Teachers worked in small groups to reflect on the data from MyOn, IRead, DIBELS, SWIS PBIS, District Math Benchmarks, and Reading Multi-Tiered Systems of Support. Each group reported out to the faculty. The teachers were engaged in the activity and worked on setting classroom goals based on the data. We are “Going for the Gold” for student growth! This activity was directly aligned to our vision of what we want all children to be able to achieve by the end of second grade.
 - We will continue to work on the math curriculum in upcoming collaborations and SIP Days.

 - The Preschool Team is engaged in the Powerful Interactions Book Club. They have a parent activity night planned for Thursday evening which will be the culmination of their clothing unit. Families will be decorating t-shirts for their preschoolers.
